To OSCAR ELSAS, greeting:

Pursuant to lawful authority, you are hereby summoned and required to appear before the COMMISSION ON INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS, or a sub-committee thereof, on Monday, March 22nd, 1915 at 10 o'clock A. M., at Taft Hall, City of Atlanta, and State of Georgia, then and there to testify what you know relative to the subject matters under consideration by said Commission, and particularly the matters within your knowledge concerning the existing relations between employers and employees in the United States; the general condition of labor in the principal industries in the United States, and especially those carried on in corporate forms; also methods which have been tried in any State for maintaining mutually satisfactory relations between employers and employees; and methods for avoiding and adjusting labor disputes through peaceful and conciliatory mediation and negotiation.

Hereof, Fail Not, as you will answer your default under the pains and penalties in such cases made and provided.
