Report of Opr. A.E.W.

Monday, June 1st, 1914.

I reported to Mr. E. G. Myers at his office at 8:00 A.M. and went over the work with him. He informed me that the employees of the mill hold meetings at the Odd Fellows Hall at the corner of Moore and Decatur Streets. I went and looked over the situation with Mr. Williams and then returned to the office at 10:00 A.M. and was introduced to Mr. Elsas, and we went over the work with him. I left the office to look for a place to locate the dictograph. I found a room at 260 1-2 Decatur St., went in and saw the agent and rented same for one month. He wanted to know for what purpose I wanted to use the rooms, and I told him to repair electric motors and general work of that kind. It was 3:00 P.M. before I could get the key, as he was out to dinner. I went back with Mr. Williams and just as we got to Moore St. we saw Mr. Miles and two other men and a tall lady, leaving the hall and locked the door. We then telephoned for the key, As soon as we got it we went to work and got our wire out of the meeting room and stopped the work on account of a lineman working on a pole nearby, as we did not want to be detected. I got some boxes from the Electric Supply Company and had them sent to the rooms, so if the agent gets to rubbering around I will have the wiring in place early in the morning.

I returned to the Hotel at 8:00 P.M. and set dictograph over the door leading to Mr. Miles room and waited for him to return.
