FULTON BAG & COTTON MILLS.

We went to our rooms on Decatur Streets, arriving there at 2:45 P.M., and got the machine fixed, ready to receive any word that might be delivered in the hall. But at 3:00 P.M. there was no talking in the hall, that I could hear, so I took a walk around Union headquarters to see if any one was there, but found the Hall closed and locked. We then returned to the hotel and I went to My room #306. At 3:20 P.M. Mr. Wilkes and Mr. Crouch left the hotel. I went down to the lobby and sat there until Mr. Miles came down.
