

S P E C I A L W O R K

Report of Operative #798.

Saturday, February 15th, 1919.

I reported for work at the Mill at 6.50 A. M. and went to Mill #2 Spooling Department. I saw the Second Hand checking off the yarn which was left over from yesterday. As usual the spoolers wanted him to check them more, and some of them were complaining of having bad yarn and so on. I did not follow him as he said he would do that himself and I had quite a few boxes of yarn to empty so I went to do that. When the Second Hand got through he handed the checker to me. I was very busy this morning.

The negro working there tries at times to take it easy at the top of the boilers, and looking down instead of helping me out. It is very tiresome to handle those full boxes all day, and besides to use his brain so as not to get mixed up with the checking.

I quit work at the Mill at 11 A. M. after handling the checker back to the Second Hand. In the afternoon at four P. M I went for inspection around the Mill, but came home after one hour as I could not see anything to consider.
