The secondhand needs a extra man to do some changeing which I am sure will make the work run better, and not change

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the shade or grade of the cloth.

At 3:00 P.M. I ask the weaver who has the new temple on #1 loom how many threads had broke today where the new temple was, he says not any. I says how many has broke on the other selvages he says not any.
