Report of Agt. #145.

Saturday, Sept. 6th, 1919.

Was at work this morning at 8:00 A.M. and nothing of importance happened during the day.

While assisting driver to load his wagon, I got in conversation with him about the threatened strike of teamsters, which is said to begin Sept. 15th, unless their demands are met.

He said that "The Fulton Bag people will feel it a whole lot because they always work their wagons overtime, especially on Saturdays," and he further stated, "The drivers want a 44 hour week and that would mean all work after 12 o'clock Saturdays would be overtime, payable at \$1.00 an hour."

As it is now, they work a 48 hour week and only get paid overtime for any work after 5:00 P.M. during six week days.

I left at 1:30 P.M. as we were busy and had to get a few orders out. Also wish to add that I am doing longshorman work when not packing and I think that the Polacks hired by the day should do the heavy work.
